
The Sodality

The Third Order has increased in enrollment and has spread throughout the world. On October 3, the eve of the feast of St. Francis, nineteen new novices were accepted into the Order. On October 4, the twenty who had completed their novitiate the previous year became professed.

During the regular monthly meetings Fr. Dominic explained the rule of the Order and its purposes. He stressed the importance of being models of St. Francis and of making their everyday life pleasing to God. A strong Christian character, as well as a close following of the rule of St. Francis, was maintained and practiced by the members of the Third Order.

A select group of choristers was chosen to chant the proper of the Mass for all Sundays of the year.







Dramatics











Well-balanced height, advantageous use of the fast break, and accurate shooting supplemented the varsity five in compiling this winning record.




Junior Varsity Basketball




Basketball Intramurals

Gymnastic Team











Ted O'Karma, last year's pingpong champion, is expected to retain his title, although he will have to face some top competition from Joe Pomaski and Denis McCarthy.


Anthony Zembrzuski will again meet Joe Flis, whom he just edged out last year for the foul-shooting trophy.






