







#### RESPONSIBILITY . . .


## Looking Back

The friends we made will live on forever in our memories. The good times will never be eradicated, for only the Class of 1968 at Padua Prep has done this, in a collective and unified effort.







### Cross Country Team Finishes Strong




#### Basketball Intramurals


### UNDERCLASSMEN
